

DIRECTORS CUT: VETERINARY RISING COSTS By Diane Robinson

I am sure everyone is all too aware of the higher cost of everything, from groceries to building supplies to fuel, clothing, and more. Medical and drug costs are also at an all-time high, with the trend including vaccinations, regular, and emergency medicine for our pets.

During the pandemic, pet guardianship increased significantly, with 66% of US households owning at least one pet in 2024 compared to 56% in 1988. Bureau of Labor Statistics data shows the price of urban veterinarian services increased by 7.9% from February 2023 to February 2024, more than 2½ times higher than the average of all consumer items. Compared with two years ago, urban vet care is up 11%, and over the last decade has soared by nearly 60%.

We are fortunate to have a veterinarian volunteering his time for our animals, saving us from some of the higher costs. However, this is not the case for altering our animals or public animals through our low-cost spay/neuter program. Thanks to grants, we are able to cover some of the costs for this program, but not all. So, what is the benefit to us for having a low-cost spay/neuter program? Altering these public animals helps to reduce unwanted litters. It, along with our food distribution program, helps to keep pets in their homes. Often, the mother cat or dog is surrendered with their litters, adding to pet overpopulation and shelter overcrowding. In conclusion, the rising costs of veterinary care and other essentials highlight the importance of our low-cost spay/neuter program and other supportive initiatives. By continuing to support these programs, we can help reduce pet overpopulation, keep pets with their families, and ensure a better quality of life for both pets and their owners. Your support and contributions are vital in making this mission a reality. Thank you for being a part of this important effort.

The safety of our animals was our top priority, and we quickly organized an emergency meeting with our dedicated staff to devise a comprehensive plan. Our program managers, Dreama and Lily, worked tirelessly to ensure we had a solid strategy in place. They coordinated efforts to shelter our cats in place and arranged for some to go to foster homes. For our dogs and puppies, the goal was to find temporary foster homes to keep them safe during the storm.

In an impressive 24-hour timeline, we successfully placed every single dog and puppy into foster homes with the help of our amazing volunteers and staff members. This incredible feat ensured that none of our pups were at the center during the storm. We are immensely grateful for the swift and generous response from our community—thank you!

While our cats were safely moved around (you can read more about this below), we couldn't have achieved this without your support. We were incredibly fortunate not to be severely impacted by the storm, unlike many of our neighbors who continue to face challenges. In the aftermath, we have been using our supplies to support the community through our pet food distribution program. We've even made trips to deliver pallets of pet food to those in need. If you would like to continue helping, we are accepting donations of cat and dog food to keep our pantry stocked and continue our efforts. Donations can be dropped off at the center or shipped in. Every bag and can helps more than you know!


