FINDING HOME AGAIN

Jake's Journey to a Second Chance

At 12 years old, Jake—a handsome grey and white cat—had already spent a lifetime with his beloved owner. Adopted as a kitten, he was her loyal companion for more than a decade.



But everything changed when they moved in with her mother so she could help provide care. Then came devastating news: Jake's owner was diagnosed with terminal cancer.

Jake stayed faithfully by her side as the home filled with caregivers, hospice workers, and visitors. For a cat who had only ever known one person, the constant activity became overwhelming. He began hiding, confused and scared.

After his owner passed, Jake was left alone in the house, with only brief visits from her sister. The once social, affectionate cat grew withdrawn and depressed. The sparkle in his eyes faded.

A dedicated Lake Oconee Humane Society (LOHS) volunteer recognized that Jake needed more than just shelter—he needed a fresh start. But once at LOHS, Jake shut down. He wouldn't eat, avoided everyone, and seemed lost in grief. The team made a heartfelt plea on social media for someone with patience and compassion to help him heal. **And someone answered.**

> A kindhearted couple saw Jake's story and welcomed him into their home. "He can have all the peace and quiet he wants," they said. Today, Jake is thriving. Bit by bit, he's begun to trust again. He's not just surviving—he's healing.

> > Jake's story is a reminder that it's never too late for a new beginning. Thanks to those who helped along the way, Jake has found his forever home and a second chance at happiness.

Candidates must be physically capable, at least 18 years old, and willing to work flexible hours including weekends and holidays.
