DIRECTOR'S CUT

Each spring, animal shelters and rescues across the nation prepare for "**kitten season**," the time of year for what seems like never ending litters arriving in need of care. The "bottle babies" are particularly challenging to care for when we get them. These kittens can be as young as a few hours old with no mother to care for them, needing aroundthe-clock care with feeding every few hours.

This season started slowly with only a few young kittens and bottle babies trickling in, but not anymore with close to 70 kittens ranging from days to weeks old in foster care. I haven't seen so many kittens in years, potentially still fallout from the 2020 shutdowns of everything, including spay/neuter programs.

Regardless of the reasons for the number of litters, LOHS is meeting the need head on. Dreama, LOHS cat manager, has been working hard for these little ones, and without the dedication of the cat fosters, we would not be able to take them into our care. There is no single solution to these challenges but with low cost spay/neuter, community cat TNR, local adoption, and transport of animals to partner organizations with more resources and a larger adopter community, these will be the lucky ones! \bullet \in **ADOPTIONS** \mathcal{T}



9. What is one thing you wish you could say to anyone looking to adopt a pup or kitty in the near future?


Pick the "under-dog" because they will truly amaze you & are truly some of the best cats/dogs ever!
