We are delighted to announce that we have officially rebranded as the Lake Oconee Humane Society (LOHS). This transition has been, and will continue to be, a meticulous process involving the conversion of all our existing information, the procurement of merchandise bearing our new logo for in-house use and public purchase, and the launch of our new website, lohspets.org. We are also in the process of redirecting traffic from the old ORHS site to our new LOHS site. Please look forward to the unveiling of our new signage in the near future.

The decision to rebrand was made after years of confusion between ORHS and Oconee County in GA and SC, as well as Greensboro, NC. The change was proposed during a public board meeting in January. The new name, Lake Oconee Humane Society, aligns us more closely with the "Lake Country" region that we serve and distinguishes us from other similarly named organizations.

LOHS is committed to serving as more than just an adoption center. Our community outreach programs, which include low-cost spay and neuter services, Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR), community medical assistance, and pet food distribution, underscore our dedication to being a valuable community resource.






My passion at LOHS is helping the local community through the food distribution program and TNR for community cats in our surrounding areas.


