

For the last 16 years, it has taken on a different meaning, the day we in the disaster response community begin looking to the tropics, the first day of hurricane season, and the kickoff for Disaster Preparedness month.

Here in the Lake Oconee region, we may not be impacted like our neighbors to the south along the Gulf or to the east on the Atlantic, but if I learned anything after all of these years in disaster response, I learned it is best to be prepared for anything. It is never a question of if something will happen, but when and how bad.

With that in mind, now is the time to put together your emergency plan and To-Go kits for you, your family and your pets, then share the emergency plan with the whole family and any animal caretakers who would be responsible for your pets when you are away from home.
