



PURRFECT MATCHES MADE

HARMONIZING ANIMAL SHELTER PRACTICES: THE POWER OF CONSISTENCY

Envision a typical shelter setting. You might see enclosures, hear barking, and smell harsh cleaning products. Now, try to envision that through a dog's point of view. Everything is intensified as dogs have remarkable sensory abilities far superior to humans. Tack on unfamiliar social interactions, confinement, other stressed animals, unpredictability, and there are no two ways about it, a shelter environment is stressful for its residents. The key to ensuring the best possible experience for our residents is to create an environment that minimizes fear, anxiety and stress (FAS) producing stimuli by creating consistency and routine. When dogs experience consistent daily schedules, they know what to expect. Imagine living in this unfamiliar environment – having a routine helps create a sense of security. For shelter dogs, this stability is essential as they adjust to their new surroundings. Consistent cleaning and handling techniques not only improve the emotional, behavioral, and physical health of the dogs, but also benefit the people around them. When everyone follows the same methods and approaches, the advantages are invaluable. The shelter becomes a safer, happier, and more welcoming place. Dogs learn skills that enrich their lives and help them become more adoptable. Staff and volunteers can see their hard work pay off in the form of happier, easier to handle dogs who get adopted more quickly and go on the thrive in adoptive homes. In summary, consistency and routine create a stable environment, improves handler safety, animal safety, and animal welfare. Let's continue to support our furry friends!

As a volunteer with the Lake Oconee Humane Society and adoring dog mom of our German Shepherd/Husky rescue, JD, I jumped at the chance to feature my handsome boy and raise money for LOHS! I'm over the moon about my experience with Charlotte Detienne, the brilliant brain and professional animal photographer behind The Lake Dog Project.

THE LAKE DOG PROJECT PROCESS

Easy. Easy! Charlotte is a total pro. She dives into your dog's story before even setting a date for the shoot, so she can plan the best shots to highlight your dog's unique personality. She asks questions about how you're planning on displaying the images to ensure she captures the perfect moment to hang on your wall. Closer to the shoot date, Charlotte walks you through what will happen and any preparation needed.

WHAT IS THE LAKE DOG PROJECT?

Local Professional animal Portrait Photographer, Charlotte Detienne, is making it her mission to photograph and tell the stories our beloved dogs, at home on Lake Oconee. The project focuses on raising funds while creating custom artwork and will eventually become a book featuring dogs living and loving life in this area. With each booking, she's making a substantial donation to Lake Oconee Humane Society.

HOW MUCH IS THE DONATION CHARLOTTE GIVES TO LOHS?

Donations range from \$100 to \$1000 (or more) depending on what level of photo session and artwork is purchased. Regardless of the level, this is a much higher amount than my kids' schools were given on any restaurant's "percentage night" fundraisers.
