We've officially switched from PetPoint to Shelterluv, a new shelter management system that will make life easier for our staff, volunteers, fosters, and adopters. So what does this mean for you?



# SIMPLIFIED ADOPTION PROCESS...WITH NO MORE STACKS OF PAPER

We're going fully digital with all our applications and adoption packets. Having realtime digital records means that we won't have to worry about missing crucial information for animals and their caretakers.

By enforcing a fully paperless system, we will help reduce waste and let staff spend less time on paperwork and more time where it matters most —caring for our animals.



#### ENHANCED MEDICAL RECORDS


This will improve communication with our Shelter Med team, helping us give every pet top-notch care.

### NEW FOSTER-FRIENDLY HUB

Our fosters will gain access to a new interactive hub to help track their pets' info and updates all in one place. **Fosterluv** will let fosters set their own capacity, schedule blackout dates, add memos and notes, update animal weights and share photos with staff.



# IMPROVED OPTIONS FOR PET REHOMING

Sometimes, life changes happen and pets need new homes. With our new courtesy listing system, families can safely rehome their pets without them ever needing to enter the shelter—keeping pets safe, loved, and out of stressful transitions.

We know there may be a few hiccups as we roll out this new system, and we appreciate your patience as we work through the transition.

Change isn't always easy, but Shelterluv will help us be more efficient, more connected, and better equipped to care for our animals. This is the direction we're moving in as an organization, and we're confident it's the right step forward—for our staff, our volunteers, and most importantly, for the pets.

# FROM HOARDING HORROR TO HAPPILY EVER AFTER

Right before the July 4th holiday, LOHS took in six dogs rescued from a heartbreaking hoarding situation in northern Georgia.

More than 260 animals were removed from severely neglected conditions in a massive rescue effort by shelters across the state.

LOHS welcomed four puppies and two adult Pomeranian mixes into our care. While the puppies were spared the worst of the trauma due to their young ages, the older dogs — Lincoln and Roosevelt — arrived terrified and withdrawn. They barely made a sound, trembling at most movement or touch. It was clear they had lived in fear for a very long time.

With weeks of patient care, gentle handling, and plenty of love from our staff and volunteers, Lincoln and Roosevelt slowly began to trust. They learned to enjoy the outdoors, wag their tails, and embrace affection and new experiences.

We're thrilled to share that all six of the dogs we welcomed from this case (puppies and Pomeranians alike) have found their happyever-afters in safe, loving homes.

Thank you to our incredible volunteers who make moments like this possible.


